Let the Iraqi people decide their future

Many thousands of Iraqi civilians have been killed since the start of the war on Iraq. Residents of Baghdad can only get electricity 6 hours a day, there is 70% unemployment, and things aren't getting any better. Coalition troops are even using Saddam's old prisons as torture chambers.

Is this the liberation Iraqis were after?

The real reason that the UK and the US were so keen to 'liberate' Iraq was the estimated 15 billion barrels of oil in Iraqi oilfields, and to safeguard that and other US interests with a government handpicked by Washington. New Iraqi PM Allawi, whose wages were being paid by the CIA before the invasion, has already done what the US wanted and handed back most of his power to the coalition troops.

The Iraqis, many glad to see the back of Saddam, are enraged by the fact that they seem to have just got another dictator, seen as 'Saddam without the moustache'. Many Iraqis have taken up arms in an attempt to fight against the occupiers.

From the invasion to September 2004, over 1,000 US troops and 121 UK and other coalition troops were killed defending the interests of the bosses.

The anti-war movement has been proved right. The case for war has been smashed by the recent enquiries, proving Blair and Bush were lying all along. The drop in Labour's vote in recent elections showed a huge decrease in support, and a big factor in this was the Iraq war.

Right from the start, ISR has played a prominent role in the anti-war movement. In the UK and internationally, we helped organise many of the school student strikes and local protests, as well as participating in national demos. Since the occupation began, we have been calling for the troops to come home, and to let the Iraqi people decide their own future. However, the Iraqi people will always be repressed as long as the world system is based on the bosses and their bank balances.

ISR is an anticapitalist organisation, run democratically by and for young people. We are campaigning for a socialist world where the resources and wealth are democratically planned and used for the benefit of all, not the profit of the few.
